Intervention and Enrichment Strategies

- Post schedule on door and allow students time for individual meetings/lessons
- Focus on technical, theoretical proficiency skills
- Allow time and provide opportunities for creativity and independence
- Provide supplementary opportunities for quick learners
- Encourage peer leadership and respectful peer evaluation
- Invite community leaders to deliver unique lessons
- Keep goals on the horizon and communicate with teachers at the next level
- Use assessments that best inform the teacher and help give the student helpful feedback
- Allow students an opportunity to fail and learn from mistakes
- Monitor student progress, and intervene if necessary
- Reach out to other professionals within the school system if needed
- Communicate with other teachers to avoid creating stress in students' lives
- Give students a chance to practice responsibility and take ownership in their education
- Let the voices of students be heard
- Hold students accountable for their inappropriate actions and poor decisions
- Connect musical concepts to other subjects and real-world situations
- Provide students with opportunities to experience music in a variety of forms
